Job Overview

The individual will require to support several key stakeholders across a number of stakeholder groups and be fully integrated with the rest of the Legal and Commercial team.

- Providing legal advice in relation to all aspects of the NEO Energy Business.
- Advising on regulatory compliance issues, in particular in relation to production licences under the Petroleum Act and also in relation to matters involving OGA, BEIS and HSE.
- Drafting and negotiating a wide range of commercial agreements relating NEO Energy's operated and non-operated assets; including SPAs, JOAs, Transportation Agreements, Product Sales etc.
- Providing support to NEO Energy's business development activities; in due diligence and other elements of corporate transactions
- Liaison with and support to Supply Chain in relation to procurement for production operations and capital projects.
- Assisting with the establishment, liquidation and management of subsidiaries, and advising on subsidiary governance.
